Annex 1 - mandatory conditions

Condition	Condition text
LA2003 - M03 - Irresponsible Promotions	The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises. For the purposes of this condition, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises: (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise); (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective; (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner; (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
LA2003 - M04 - Potable Water	The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
LA2003 - M05 - Age Verification Policy	The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:- (a) a holographic mark, or (b) an ultraviolet feature.

LA2003 - M06 - Measures	The responsible person shall ensure that - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint; (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.
LA2003 - M07 - Permitted Price	A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price. For the purposes of this condition: (a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula $P = D + (D \times V)$, where - (i) P is the permitted price, (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol; (b) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979; (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence - (i) the holder of the premises licence, (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence; (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994. Where the permitted price given by paragraph (a) above would not be a whole number of pennies, the price shall be rounded up to the nearest

	penny. Where the permitted price on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax, the permitted price on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
LA2003 - M12 - Films	The admission of children to the exhibition of any film shall be restricted in accordance with: (a) the classification of the film by the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984, or (b) a notice given by the Licensing Authority under section 20(3) of the Licensing Act 2003. For the purpose of this condition, access shall not be considered restricted unless the premises or parts thereof are wholly enclosed from neighbouring areas (including external parts) and access can only be gained by means of one or more discrete point(s) of entry.
LA2003 - M08 - DPS Disapplied	Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by the Management Committee.

Annex 2 - conditions consistent with the applicant's operating schedule

1. There shall be effective and responsible management of the premises
2. There shall be a 30 minutes 'drinking up' time after the last permitted sale of alcohol
3. The licence holder reserves the right to move the fire appliances, AWP machines, and/or other similar objects temporarily in a fixed location which may impact on the ability of individuals on the premises to use exits or escape routes without impediment.
4. There shall be acceptance of an accredited proof of age scheme
5. Outside areas shall be regularly cleared of glasses etc.
6. There shall be information on the availability of taxi services
7. The premises licence holder or their representative shall be a member of PubWatch Scheme.
8. There shall be regular testing (and certification) of procedures, appliances etc.
9. There shall be an adequate and maintained emergency lighting system, fire alarm and firefighting equipment and illuminated fire exit signs.
10. Outside lighting shall be provided
11. A suitably maintained first aid box shall be available on the premises
12. There shall be responsible collection and disposal of litter
13. No entertainment of an adult of sexual nature shall be provided
14. AWP machines shall be in a highly visible area for monitoring of play
